- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making

Learning Excellence Actions

- Implementing daily Math Talks with pre-teaching of key vocabulary
- Vocabulary sound/word walls
- Explicit instruction using UFLI /Heggerty program to improve-phonological awareness and decoding text.
- Focused PLC work that promotes collaboration between teachers and continual data analysis of common tasks and assessment practice
- Effective use of technology that supports and engages student learning
- Mandarin YCT (Youth Chinese Test) Grade 4





Well-Being Actions

- Utilize the Well-Being Framework and Companion Guide
- I CAN statements (Well-being Framework)
- Continually connect learning to our school statement "We Belong"
- Daily use of mindfulness programming (MindUp, Brainwise, BABSBR, Mindful Activity Cards) with common vocabulary instruction to support self-regulation, positive relationships, positive sense of belonging, and problem-solving strategies.
- Front-loaded vocabulary instruction.
- School-wide participation in Connect Friday/Family Groupings

^{*} For Swimming, we incurred the following expenses: \$8,945 for bus transportation, \$7,672 for admission fees. We have unpaid fees of \$1,183. Parent Council has donated \$4,620 for bussing transportation.

^{**} For Heritage Park, we incurred the following expenses: \$2,280 for admission fees we experienced unpaid fees of \$218 to be absorbed by school general funds. Bussing was also paid by School Council.

^{**} For Calgary Zoo, we incurred the following expenses: \$1,150 for admission fees, \$885 for bus transportation. We have unpaid fees of \$547 to be absorbed by school general funds. Bussing was also paid by School Council

^{***}For Quest Theatre, we incurred the following expense \$11,000 for the event. This was a school wide event and we experienced unpaid fees of \$485. Parent Council has supported this event by donating \$5,500.

^{****} The \$1,516 loss will be absorbed by the school.


